Happiness Survey

Each year in school, we conduct our Happiness Survey for all of our children. We ask them about all aspects of school life: their work, their friendships, relationships with adults, bullying, online safety to name but a few. We feel it is important to gauge the children's opinions and where children aren't happy we have follow-up conversations to clarify the issue.

This year there is strong evidence of the impact of our work on Protective Behaviours. All of the children in school know that adults in school will help them if they have a problem. They also reported that they now know what to do if they feel unsafe online following our work on online safety earlier this term.

The children are asked if there is bullying in school. Reassuringly the vast majority (over 95%) said there isn't. Where children have said there is we have obviously asked questions about who and when it happened. For many children they are recalling incidents from the past - more than 3 years ago. For others they thought it was happening but could not give any specifics. Some of the examples given were incidents of children being unkind but would not be classed as bullying. When talking to them we reiterated the message that bullying is about exerting power and happens on a regular basis and your early warning signs do not go away. There were a few incidents that needed further investigation and these have now been dealt with after reminding pupils the importance of reporting things to adults straight away so they can be resolved.

The other issue that remains a concern is that pupils are reporting that adults at home don't always know what they are doing online. With increasing numbers of games and apps that allow interaction with other people, it is important that we know who our children are talking to. The children have the tools to report something if it makes them feel unsafe, but ideally we don't want them in such a situation in the first place.

Overall, the results were very positive. There are things we can now work on as a school to make even better after listening to the children. This is something we strive for and the improvement from last year to this is evident. Our children think our school is a happy, safe place to learn where relationships are good and adults will help. Hands on Guided Reading

This week we invited parents into school from Year 1- Year 6, so they could participate in their children's learning. Over this academic year we will be encouraging our parents to come into school more often. There are two reasons for this:

- We want you to enjoy more time with your child in school, so they can see you are part of their learning too.
- It is also helpful for you as a parent to see how we teach your child certain skills.

Guided reading is a chance for the class to read a quality text which is steeped in adventurous vocabulary and engages our children. Around that text we plan a number of activities e.g. reading together, comprehension questions, storyboarding, vocabulary hunts, phonics tasks and much more. That is why we thought it would be lovely for you to come in and experience what your children do each morning at school.
