Anti- Bullying Week

Our schools have been recognised for the children's positive behaviour and as a school we pride ourselves on the nurturing and caring environment that we have created together. A strength of our school is the respect children have for each other and children talk positively about being part of a family.

Like all families, there are disagreements. People do not always see eye to eye - its human nature. Children do fall out with each other, say mean things and occasionally hurt each other. This is unacceptable behaviour and we deal with it when it happens using a restorative approach. Aiming to maintain relationships where possible between the children. This is not nice, can make children feel sad and lonely but these isolated incidents are not bullying. Children often use the term bullying to describe when someone is mean to them. They are misusing the term.

Bullying is not a 'single isolated incident', but is something that is more likely to be targeted, planned and repeated. We are working with our children to develop their understanding of this. It is a situation where their Early Warning Signs never go away.

Bullying is thankfully extremely rare in our schools, but in almost every organisation (including those most adults work in) it is present in some shape or form. Any school or any organisation which says 'we have no bullying probably has a poor understanding of what it is or are sweeping it under the carpet. Our role is to ensure that we give children an understanding of what it is, the power and support to tackle it and create a climate where it is totally unacceptable and if it occurs it is extremely rare and stamped out immediately.

Thankfully, over the past five years our 'bullying logs' show less than a handful of incidents, which is an extraordinary result that we are very proud of. However, we are never complacent and will continue to work hard to ensure that our children treat each other with the highest levels of respect.

The most important message to share is that if a child has their Early Warning Signs they are to tell an adult on their network straight away so the situation can be addressed.

Pen Panel

This week, our first **PEN PANEL** took place this academic year. Maisie, Nicole, Lewis, Rosie and I looked at three English books per class (in KS2) and the team had to decide whether the children could receive the next pen or not. As we are a democracy here at Dordon, we decided to put the pen ownership back on the children. Staff suggested pupils who should try for the next pen at the Pen Panel, but ultimately it is now up to the children. Once the children came to the panel our Key Stage 2



team used posters and writing exemplification to decide whether each child should move on to the next pen. I have to be honest, I thought I would have to support the children in making their decisions, but it was the opposite - they knew exactly what to say!

Watching the children receive their pens was a special moment. They were all so excited and eager to use them. There were also children who did not receive the next pen on this occasion, but they listened carefully to the advice the Pen Panel provided to help them improve.

We hope this will give children better insight in what they need to do to improve their handwriting in the coming year.
