Keeping in Touch

I hope that this edition of the newsletter finds you all well. We are now 3 weeks into opening and the children in school are settled and used to the new routines. The numbers at both schools have increased this week and I would urge parents of children in Reception, Years 1 and 6 to take us up on the offer of a place in school. We have well established routines now to ensure the safety of pupils and staff.

This week, the government has talked about the wider opening of schools to Years 2-5 if they have capacity. Unfortunately with current guidance remaining unchanged and our arrangements for current year groups and for key worker and vulnerable pupils, we have no capacity to open any more social groups. We do however recognise the importance of seeing the children and maintaining the relationships that have been a strength at our schools.

We are looking to host Zoom meetings over the coming weeks to establish links with the children. In the first instance, they will be able to speak to their current class teacher and see half of their class group. We are limiting the number of children on each call to ensure it is a quality experience. Watch out for an email on how and when to join your child's meeting.

The next Zoom meeting will be with their new class teacher. This will give them a chance to see their new teacher and talk to them about what they are looking forward to. We are hoping this may alleviate any anxiety over the summer holiday. We are also going to send out a transition booklet containing details about new class arrangements to prepare children for their return to school.

We do recognise the importance of face to face meetings and whilst we cannot accommodate the children in school on a long term basis, we are going to have a picnic in the last week of term. This will again be with half the class at a time, with their current class teacher and socially distanced outside. This is obviously weather dependant so keep your fingers crossed for sunshine! Details will be emailed closer to the date.

What to do if you are feeling unwell

Step 1: Symptoms

If a child, staff member or member of your household develops a symptom, <u>STAY AT HOME</u>.

Call school at once to notify us

If your child or a staff member develops a symptom in school, they will be sent home.

Step 2: Isolation and Testing

Person with symptoms STAY AT HOME for at least 7 days and book a test:

(www.nhs.uk/coronavirus or call 119). Rest of the household STAY AT HOME for 14 days (see government advice for ending isolation).

Rest of the social group to be notified of the situation.

Step 3: Positive Test-

Confirmed Infection

Child or adult testing positive remains in isolation alongside their family. Follow latest government guidance.

The social group for that child or staff member will be closed for 14 days AND children and staff MUST isolate.

Step 3: Negative Test

Where the child or adult tests negative, all isolation ends and anyone connected who was in isolation returns to work or school.

Step 4: Further Action

School notifies Public Health England and the rest of the school continues as normal with the risk assessment in place. School will only close if told to do so by PHE.

Classroom for the social group will be deep cleaned.

Test and Trace will be operated for the infected person.
