For this Parent's Evening, many of our school are introducing an electronic booking in system using our 'E-Schools Virtual Learning Environment'. If not yet introduced at your child's school, it is coming very soon.

We remain very keen to further increase the number of visitors from our parent body and community. Our grandparents lunch, Governors visits and all manner of 'specialists' among many others, has taught us that the children can benefit from the huge range of expertise and experiences that our community has and enrich the children's learning.

During a typical week we may be visited by the following people: Parents to hear children readers or for assemblies, the school nurse, speech therapist, teachers from one of our primary schools or The Polesworth School, prospective parents, Children Centre staff, colleagues from our Pre-School, education psychologist, the police, children's services, Education Social Workers to inspect registers, teacher advisors, moderators, Governors and so on!!!

Despite all the logistical problems we need to address because of strict regulations over 'child protection', visitors to our school remain very important. It is of course far easier to have no visitors into school, but we wish to involve our community in the life of the school. Initiatives such as holding a 'Grandparents Lunch' and 'Parents Show Case Evenings' are very popular with the children and their families, they present a wonderful opportunity for our children to show grandparents and parents around our school and inside classes. Improved understanding results in improved progress for our children!

This year we are making further big improvements. We are increasing the number and range of amazing visitors and visits to incredible places. Each year group will make at least one visit into our community, a trip per term, have at least one visitor into school from our community and make one visit to a place of worship.

Myths and Legends

A selection of comments and misconceptions we sometimes hear

'Midday Supervisors', as we now know them, never force children to eat what they don't like! However, we DO encourage children to try new foods, and 'have one more mouthful' because we know that some children are notoriously 'picky' eaters. Our Midday Supervisors also do a really important job in checking that children have had a good go at eating their packed lunches. With the attraction of a chocolate covered biscuit, or cake for pudding, encouraging children to eat a ham sandwich is always a big challenge!

Each week we ask the children a quick 'outside of school' safety question in the same message. This week:

In the event of particularly poor weather (or other emergency situations) the Head of School makes the decision whether to close the school or not. This decision is based on a number of important factors and it is always an extremely difficult decision. You can never please everyone!

- The priority MUST be to ensure the safety of young children
- The school needs to be in full working order and in a safe condition to accept children (i.e. heating, electricity, water, the building, cooking facilities must all be operational. Health and Safety law MUST be adhered to)
- The school MUST have the correct ratio of staff on site to look after the children properly
- We need to be aware that some staff travel a very long way to get to work and may put themselves in danger doing so in poor weather conditions. The majority of children live within a short walking distance of school.

As a result of the above, each school makes its own decision as to open or close when conditions are challenging. Just because a neighbouring school is open or closed does not mean our school could do the same. We all operate under different circumstances, with different staff and with different day to day arrangements.

If the school is closed before the day starts we will post this on the school Twitter account. If you do not have a Twitter account go to the school webpage www.dordonprimaryschool.co.uk and you will see the Twitter feed on the homepage. It is essential that parents/carers DO NOT send ANY children to school unaccompanied when weather conditions are particularly poor, without FIRST checking on the website that the school is open. Parents will be informed when the school is open again via the website and Twitter.
