Cut Out and Keep Safe - Please ensure you KEEP a copy of the procedures for school closure, in case of particularly poor weather.

In the event of particularly poor weather (or other emergency situations) the Executive Headteacher makes the decision whether to close the school or not. This decision is based on a number of important factors and it is always an extremely difficult decision. You can never please everyone!

- The priority MUST be to ensure the safety of young children
- The school needs to be in full working order and in a safe condition to accept children (i.e. heating, electricity, water, the building, cooking facilities must all be operational. Health and Safety law MUST be adhered to)
- The school MUST have the correct ratio of staff on site to look after the children properly
- We need to be aware that some staff travel a very long way to get to work and may put themselves in danger doing so in poor weather conditions. The majority of children live within a short walking distance of school.

As a result of the above, each school makes its own decision as to open or close when conditions are challenging. Just because a neighbouring school is open or closed does not mean our school could do the same. We all operate under different circumstances, with different staff and with different day to day arrangements.

If the school is closed before the day starts we will post this on the school Twitter account. If you do not have a Twitter account go to the school webpage www.dordonprimaryschool.co.uk and you will see the Twitter feed on the homepage. It is essential that parents/carers DO NOT send ANY children to school unaccompanied when weather conditions are particularly poor, without FIRST checking on the website that the school is open. Parents will be informed when the school is open again via the website and Twitter.
