British Values

In our school we teach children to be respectful of each other and we believe that by learning about the differences and beliefs of others we will develop a greater understanding and tolerance. Our one word school rule matches this aim. We expect the theme of RESPECT to underpin all aspects of life in school and is one of our fundamental British Values.

The government set out its definition of 'British values' in its Prevent Strategy and these values have been reiterated by the Prime Minister this academic year. We reinforce these regularly and in the following ways:

- ✓ <u>Democracy</u>: Democracy is rife in our schools! Pupils have their voices heard through our School Council and Pupil questionnaires. We elect House Captains, our School Council, as well as vote on 'Charity for the Year'.
- ✓ The Rule of Law: The importance of Law, i.e. those that govern the class, the school, or the country, are consistently reinforced, as well as when dealing with behaviour and through school assemblies. Pupils are taught the value and reasons behind laws that govern and protect us, responsibilities this involves and the consequences when laws are broken. Visits from authorities such as the Police; Fire Service; Lifeguards etc. are regular parts of our calendar. Pupil are regularly rewarded for great behaviour with stars, certificates 'postcards home' etc
- ✓ <u>Individual Liberty:</u> Our pupils are actively encouraged to make choices, knowing that they are in a safe environment
- ✓ <u>Tolerance</u>: Pupils learn about everyone's right to their opinion, even if we don't always agree. We promote this through discussion and through conflict resolution. Pupils are taught how to manage situations where both parties have differing viewpoints.
- Mutual Respect: Through our programmes of RE and PSHE, pupils learn about other people and their beliefs. It is important that pupils understand that we are all different and that is what makes our country great. Respect for all underpins all of our work in school and that has been recognised by countless visitors into school. The care demonstrated for each other is apparent in every facet of school life.

In our community, it is vital that these essential British Values are promoted and not undermined. At school, we will continue to develop aspects of these key skills in all that we do.

I feel proud to work with such dedicated people, who work tirelessly to make Dordon the best it can be for our young people. I want to say thank you for your continued support.



Children need to be taught to deal with things they don't like happening to them properly. In school we tell them that hitting back is not acceptable. We simply ask:


'If someone does or says something you don't like, say 'Stop It Please!'. If this doesn't stop the problem, go to an adult who will ALWAYS deal with the problem immediately.

Changes to procedure in poor weather conditions

In poor weather, such as snow, it is almost impossible to clear all of the paved areas and playgrounds to make sure they are safe. We therefore close all the pedestrian gates and playgrounds and make sure we properly clear and salt the driveway, pedestrian path along the driveway and access to the Pre-School.

When the above occurs children in Year 2 and upwards should enter school by the front door. Year 1 and Reception children should enter school via a single path that will be cleared across the playground from the front entrance.

We are always very grateful to any parents who are able to turn out in the snow and help our Site Manager clear paths from 7.00 am in the morning. Any help is wonderful!
