## Happiness Survey

Every year, we complete a Happiness Survey in school to measure how happy the children are and identify any potential problem areas in school.

Overall the results from the children were positive. Some of the key highlights are as follows:

- 98% of pupils report feeling safe most of the time.
- 97% of children know that adults will solve problems or help if asked.
- 97% of children reported that the people in school care about them.
- 96% of children use 'Stop It Please' if they feel they need to.

It was reassuring that only 4 children didn't know which adults they could speak to if they have a problem and this will be addressed through our work on networks as part of 'Protective Behaviours'.

It is clear that the children recognise there are still some children who do not show respect all of the time but they do feel adults are addressing any issues in school.

It is very important that as a school we listen to the children, to give them a voice so that necessary changes can be made. Our aim is for ALL children to be happy coming to school and to know they are safe once they are here.

I look forward to repeating the survey next year to measure the impact of the work we are undertaking in school on safety and emotional health and wellbeing.
