The progress seen in books and lessons in our recent monitoring show that children are achieving well and teachers are tailoring lessons to meet the needs of all children.

There have been a number of projects undertaken at each school. At Wood End, the Den has been setup as a space to provide effective provision for different groups of learners in school, the playground has some new additions and we are about to have a new roof. At Dordon, the library has been installed and we are about to put the books back in, there have been additions to the playground and we are about to start renovating the old pool space.

We have been pleased by the attendance of parents at a number of events in school including MacMillan Coffee Morning, Hands On Guided Reading sessions, Phonics sessions in Reception, our Online Safety Assembly to name but a few. The children continue to be the best asset our schools have. They report being happy and feeling safe in school which has been recognised by everyone who visits our school.
