I am in a privileged position being the head of two schools. The children are fantastic and I enjoy hearing all their stories about their adventures out of school. Walking round school I get to see the children hard at work and engaged in their learning. It is an absolute joy.

Say #Hello Yellow!


On Thursday 10th October we will

Spotlight- THRIVE


We want all our children at Dordon Primary School to flourish, so we have introduced THE THRIVE APPROACH in order to support their emotional and social development. Our aim is to help your children feel happy and secure, able to enjoy friendships, relate well to others and be ready and able to learn.

THRIVE is a specific way of working with all children that helps to develop their social and emotional well-being. It supports them in becoming more self-assured, capable and adaptable. They may signal their distress by becoming more withdrawn, or distant, or perhaps more challenging or disruptive, or even by trying too hard to please. If this happens we use THRIVE to look beyond the behaviour to give these children the support they need to get back on track.

We use a screening tool to identify gaps in children's social, emotional and mental health and create action plans which suggests specific activities to support the children.

I would like to take this opportunity to say thank you to those of you that attended the THRIVE Introduction on Monday. It was great to share THRIVE with you and hope that you found it beneficial.

Children who read Succeed!

Home Reading

Helping your child achieve their weekly Reading Target is absolutely

vital. This task does not need to be difficult to achieve. It only needs 5 minutes to sit and listen to your child and it makes all the difference to your child's progress in school. Make sure that every time your child reads it is written down in their record and signed so that they can receive their GEMS reward once a week.

Reporting absences

PLEASE report absences from school by 8.30am on the day of absence by telephoning the school and leaving a message on the answer phone or by emailing admin2018@welearn365.com.

If we do not hear from you we need to PROTECT CHILDREN by calling parents to make sure that a child has not left home and then not appeared in school. Not adhering to this policy wastes valuable office time phoning up parents to find out why a child is missing from school.

Could you please also send a letter to explain the reason for your child's absence on their first day back. If we do not receive confirmation of the reason for your child's absence we will have no choice but to mark the absence as unauthorised.

ParentPay


Could we ask all parents to make sure that there are no outstanding debts on their children's ParentPay accounts. All meals taken, swimming lessons, activities and trips need to be paid for as soon as possible. If you need a Paypoint card to pay for school dinners or a barcoded letter for other activities please contact the school office who will be pleased to help.

Encouraging children to drink.

We encourage the children to drink often, and provide cooled and filtered water for this purpose. Unfortunately, because of serious problems with wasps and ants, as well as other health issues, children are NOT permitted to bring any other drink into school including 'flavoured water'. The only exception to this is fruit juice in lunchboxes.
