Growth Mindset

This is a term the children will have heard in school as it is part of the acronym GEMS. But what is it?

Growth mindset is about empowering people to believe that they can achieve. At our school we don't put glass ceilings on the abilities of children. We offer them the opportunities needed to help them succeed and reach their full potential. In class it is about building resilience and perseverance - these are crucial skills in achieving a growth mindset.

It is about changing "I can't do it!" into "I can't do it <u>yet!</u>" I often talk to children in terms of walking as a baby or learning to count. There was a time when it was difficult and you fell over often but you didn't stay sitting there thinking 'It's too hard', you carried on and now it is automatic. The same with counting to 10.

We want to promote success but if something is always easy and you never find things hard or make mistakes then you are not learning. We want to develop learners who relish a challenge who show grit and determination to succeed even when there are barriers in front of them. It is all too easy to give up and stop trying. The best learners never stop learning and challenging themselves.

As adults, the skills of resilience and perseverance are key. Anyone who has had to build flat-pack furniture will be testimony to that. Not everything in life is easy, there are challenges but it is about how you face them and continue to move on. "The mistake isn't falling down, the mistake is choosing not to try to get up."

So there may be times this year when your child will come home from school and say their work is 'too hard'. That will be because they have been set a challenge. Talk to them about their growth mindset and help them to believe they will be able to do it one day it just might not be <u>yet</u>.

Spot Light on Excellence...

"One day off school doesn't matter."

Many parents may feel that one day missed off school will not make a difference but it is surprising the impact of one lost day.

A typical day at school

8.30 - Children arrive in the playground, they greet their friends and catch up and share things that have happened at home.

8.40 - Children come into school for registration and morning activities. This may be a short maths activity, practising handwriting or a vocabulary game.

8.55 - Guided Reading. Children listen or read a book and explore the characters, events and themes. Children also change their reading books

9.20 - English. A learning journey based around a text, building skills towards written outcomes.

10.20 - Playtime

10.40 - Phonics, Grammar and Spelling (VGPS). Children work in groups to learn new graphemes and spelling rules to support their writing.

11.00 - Maths. Teaching a mastery approach involves introducing a variety of methods then allowing children to develop skills to solve problems.

12.00/12.10 - Lunch. During lunchtime there are a variety of clubs on offer for children. We also have a sports coach on the playground to encourage children to be active.

1.00 - Registration and handwriting. Learning correct letter formation and perfecting joins to support our presentation when writing.

1.15 - Maths meeting. A maths session to reinforce mathematical facts including time tables, knowledge of shape and measures

1.30 - Learning based around our theme. This learning will involve art, technology, geography or history.

2.40 - Assembly. Time to reflect on issues that affect us and the world we live in.

3.00 - Go home.

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As you can see children miss so much in just one day and it can be difficult for some children to catch up when they return to school.
