Online Safety

Tuesday is **Safer Internet Day**. We will be completing work in school around staying safe online reinforcing our SMART rules. This is a simple way to remind children the different ways they need to stay safe in the online environment.

- **S** Safe keep yourself safe by not sharing your personal information online
- M Meet do not arrange to meet people you have only met online
- A- Accept do not accept emails, texts, messages or files from unknown sources as they may contain viruses
- R Rely do not believe everything you read and see online
- T Tell if you experience your early warning signs when online tell someone straight away

There is a danger that children do not apply the same safety rules online as they do in the real world. If you ask them whether they would give their photograph to a stranger on the street they are really clear that they wouldn't. However, children are less perturbed by the idea of posting a photograph online. Our job isn't to stop children from using online platforms but to teach them how to do so safely and more importantly what to do if they don't feel safe.

Pen Panel


