### Our Values

At Dordon, we aim to instil in the children the core values of Modern Britain. It is important that we nurture these through all aspects of school life from the classroom, to the dining room and the playground. Our one word school rule – RESPECT – lies at the heart of all the values. We look for pupils to live and breathe these values throughout their time at Dordon. It is not about a display or a poster but about the lived experiences of pupils in our care.

'British values' were identified by the government as part of its Prevent Strategy, and we reinforce these regularly and in the following ways:

- ✓ <u>Democracy</u>: Democracy is rife in our schools! Pupils have their voices heard through our School Council and Pupil questionnaires. We elect House Captains, our School Council, as well as vote on 'Charity for the Year'.
- ✓ <u>The Rule of Law:</u> The importance of Laws are consistently reinforced, as well as when dealing with behaviour and through school assemblies. Pupils are taught the value and reasons behind laws, that govern and protect us. Visits from the Police; Fire Service; Lifeguards etc are regular. Pupils are rewarded for great behaviour with stars, certificates and 'postcards home'
- ✓ <u>Individual Liberty:</u> Children are actively encouraged to make choices, knowing that they are in a safe and supportive environment. We provide the boundaries for children to make choices safetly. Pupils are encouraged to know, understand and exercise their rights and personal freedoms through our Online Safety and PSHE lessons. Pupils are given the freedom to make choices.
- ✓<u>Mutual Respect</u>: Our school ethos and behaviour policy revolves around our core values through our 'one word school rule'. Assemblies relate to what this means. Posters around the school promote respect for others and this is reiterated through our classroom and learning rules.
- ✓ <u>Tolerance of those of Different Faiths and Beliefs:</u> This is achieved through enhancing pupils understanding of their place in a culturally diverse society. We offer opportunities to experience diversity through visits to places of worship and year group links to other schools in areas which are different to our own. Assemblies about prejudices and prejudice-based bullying are followed.

When people visit our school, they talk about the 'feel of the place' and this is British Values in action – mutual respect and a supportive, inclusive environment where individuals are able to flourish.

#### Start of the School Day

The school day starts at 8.40am. Gates are open from 8.30am to allow parents and children to arrive on time. Children are not allowed on to the playground before 8.30am as they will be unsupervised. If children need to be cared for before this time. we recommend the services of our local 'Before and After School' providers.

Children from Reception to Year 2 must be supervised by their parent (or assigned adult which the school has been made aware of) until collected from the playground by their teacher at 8.40am.

Children MUST NOT enter school before 8.30am.
