## Covid-19 Update

I am writing this as the country moves into the new 3 tier approach to managing the pandemic. This area remains at medium risk, for now, but the measures currently in place are still having a huge impact on the everyday running of school.

As we approach the end of the first half term under what is being termed as the 'new normal' things remain far from normal in our school. We have adapted to the changes well and the children have been brilliant but there are still challenges that lie ahead.

### Parents Evening

Normally we would be preparing to set up our parents evening meetings. Obviously, things will be a little different this year. Instead of inviting parents in for an appointment, class teachers will be telephoning parents. You will be able to make an appointment through Eschools in the usual way, but different year groups will be on different days simply because of the availability of phone lines. An email will be sent out when the booking windows open and this will provide further information.

### Extra-curricular activities

This is an area that remains under review. Over the course of the next half term we will be deciding if we can increase this provision. This will depend on the possible take up of a club by an individual bubble. We cannot cross bubbles as per our risk assessment.

#### <u>Christmas</u>

Covid-19 is going to have a significant impact on all the activities we normally do in school during the run up to Christmas. The Christmas Fayre would be classed as a mass gathering and would be illegal. We are currently unable to sing inside, so our traditional Christmas plays and performances cannot happen. We have booked our Christmas dinner day, but this will not be with the whole school all together as is usually the case. We will aim to make Christmas in school as special as we can, but it is highly unlikely we will be able to share this with the community as we would like to.

As always, we will aim to keep the community updated on events in school through email and the social media pages. We appreciate your understanding and hopefully next year will be much more 'business as usual' - if we adhere to the current guidance.
