Bullvina

Bullying is thankfully extremely rare in our schools, but as in every organisation (including those most adults work in) it is sometimes present in some shape or form. Any school or any organisation which says 'we have no bullying' probably has a poor understanding of what it is, or is just being 'economical with the truth'. Our role is to ensure that:

- We give children an understanding of what it is.
- The power and support to tackle it.
- Create a climate where it is totally unacceptable and alien to us.

Children, as well as adults, often get the definition of 'bullying' wrong. They also use what is a very strong 'description' wrongly. Whilst children and adults will sometimes say 'my child is being bullied', in reality what is happening most often is children bickering or arguing with each other. Bullying is not usually a 'single isolated incident' of another child saying or doing something unpleasant to another person, but is something that is more likely to be planned and repeated.

Our schools operate in an extremely ordered and friendly environment, with a really strong system for stopping things occurring when any of us don't like it. Thankfully, over the past five years our 'bullying logs' show less than a handful of incidents, which is an extraordinary result that we are very proud of. However, we are not complacent and will continue to work hard to ensure that our children treat each other with the highest levels of respect.

We always investigate accusations of bullying and resolve any concerns quickly and with sensitivity. In addition to the above we diarise 'check ups' to make sure the problem has not returned in future months. Our regular assemblies, PSHE sessions, our clear 'Stop It Please' system and strong ethos all help children to feel empowered to tackle any issue. If you ever have concerns always come and tell us and we will work together to resolve any problems in a sensitive manner.

It allows us to provide more resources for ALL children in school not just those in receipt for a free school meal.

General tips for parents

Try to set limits on Internet usage at home. It's not a good idea for children to spend inordinate amounts of time in front of a screen, be it TV, games console or computer so make sure you set house rules on how the Internet is to be used at home: which sites can be visited, how long each member can spend on the computer, etc. Microsoft has a downloadable 'Online Code of Conduct Contract' you can print off for each family member to sign, which provides a reasonable list of ground rules for families to follow.
