### **Transition**

Yesterday the children spent time with their new teachers in their new classroom. There were lots of smiling faces in school and a buzz of excitement. The aim of this transition morning is to alleviate any worries children may have about their new class to avoid them becoming distressed over the summer holiday period. As we all know, change is stressful. We all feel the same pressures when we move house, change jobs, etc. and it is no different for children. School is built around routines so the idea of changing what is so familiar to them is daunting. Hopefully after the transition morning, children know the basics about how life will be in September. The key information is the adults they will be working with every day, where their classroom is, where their cloakroom is and which doors they will use.

For some children who find aspects of school more tricky, Miss Lewis (SENDCO) has devised a transition booklet with pictures of the key information and key people. This goes home with the children and they can look at it over the summer holiday period so that doubts can be addressed as they arise.

The greatest transition taking place in school is for our Y6 pupils. The children spent the day at Polesworth yesterday but this is the culmination of a transition programme that starts in Year 5 with visits into school by Polesworth staff and visits by the children to Polesworth. This enables the children to become more familiar with the buildings, staff and expectations.

We believe that transition is a crucial part of the work we do in school and it should put children at ease. However, as always, if you have any concerns about the transition or your child appears to have worries beyond the usual nervousness, please contact school and arrange to speak to someone. The last thing we want is for a summer holiday to be dampened by worry.

### Weight management

By encouraging your child to eat a healthy balanced diet, restricting the amounts of foods containing sugar and fat, and encouraging your child to get plenty of physical activity they should maintain a healthy weight.



Even though your Children are growing, it's important to make sure they get just the right amount of food for their age - not too little and not too much here are a few tips;

- Give your children, kid's size portions, it sounds obvious but an adult's tummy is bigger than a kid's tummy – so try to give them portion that matches their size.
- Watch packaging sizes. Lots of foods and drinks, like cans of pop, are designed for adults or for sharing.
