### **Trips and Visits**

As part of our broad and balanced curriculum, we endeavour to offer a wide range of trips, visits, visitors and experiences to our children to support and develop their learning.

Trips and visits are rooted in the curriculum. There is always a clear learning purpose that is outlined to me before the visit can be approved. The visit will be an integral part of learning that takes place in the classroom before and after the visit and will enhance the provision we deliver in school.

As a school, we are mindful of the cost of trips and try where possible to balance out more expensive trips with trips that cost us less. There have been a number of trips over the past year that have been subsidised by school to minimise the cost to parents. As always if there are issues then please contact the office to arrange an appointment to speak to Miss McGroarty. We can arrange payment plans and agree deadlines with you.

Although school trips request voluntary contributions from parents, there is not an infinite pot of money within school to subsidise trips where large numbers of parents do not contribute. As you will be aware through the media, school budgets are shrinking and by default so is the capacity of school to be able to subsidise visits. Where parental contributions are minimal, we will be left in a position where we will have no choice but to cancel trips as the costs will be too great. This is not a position we want to be in.

We look forward to continuing to provide exciting experiences for pupils at our school and thank you for your continued support.
