#### Encouraging New Clubs and Activities using the Sports Premium

The Government is currently providing funding to develop and improve sport in primary schools. This funding will see money going directly to primary school head teachers to spend on improving the quality and also provision of sport and PE for all their children.

Schools will have to spend the sport funding on improving their provision of PE and sport, but have 'the freedom' to choose how they do this. Possible uses for the funding include:

- hiring specialist PE teachers or qualified sports coaches to work alongside primary teachers
- new or additional sport clubs
- paying for professional development opportunities for school staff in PE/sport
- providing cover to release primary teachers for professional development in PE/sport
- running sport competitions, or increasing participation in the school games
- buying quality assured professional development modules or materials for PE/sport
- providing places for pupils on after school sport clubs and holiday clubs.

Despite promises of 'reduced bureaucracy' there are strings. Details of how schools spend their PE and sport grant must be published and schools must also include detail about the impact this funding has on pupils' PE and sport participation and attainment. OFTSED also inspect the impact of the funding.

Although Sport Premium only amounts to approximately £5 a child, in our schools we are determined to develop some exciting an imaginative ways to use the money for the children such as:

- A sports coach to develop exciting and imaginative warm up activities for each lesson
- A new training package for teachers so they deliver a wider variety of excellent PE lessons
- A new tracking system to make sure we can better help pupils improve their skills
- Attendance of inter school sports competitions for as many children as possible
- · Introduce lunchtime fitness sessions
- Introduce new after school hockey clubs
- · Attend swimming gala and other local sports events
- Subsidize and introduce new sport clubs for pupils.

#### Myths and Legends

A selection of comments and misconceptions we sometimes hear

'My child doesn't like water'.....

In reality it is difficult to dislike water because it is generally tasteless, odourless and inoffensive. Children saying 'they don't like water' is nearly always a preference rather than a dislike. We don't allow flavoured waters or any other kind of drink in school (apart from fruit at lunch or milk at break) because of the huge problems caused by attracting wasps and ants into school.
