
What should children wear in school? Revised uniform list from April 2016

We believe that children should wear uniform in school. We would like children to have pride in being a part of Dordon Primary School and in maintaining a well-dressed and smart appearance. Our uniform has been designed so that much of it is easily obtainable from chain stores.

If your child is unable to wear an item of the uniform temporarily, please let us know by letter. We have never yet sent a child home for being improperly dressed, but we reserve the right to do so. If you are not sure about what is appropriate we would be pleased to talk with you.

Our school has recently changed its uniform and we are now in a transition period. Our smart new navy uniform replaces our former green uniform. To allow parents with new uniform the opportunity to 'wear out' older uniform and not go to unnecessary expense, we are allowing a full year for the new changes to occur. **Our new navy blue uniform is compulsory from April 2017**.



- Jewellery or any make up must not be worn in school at any time.
- We prefer children <u>NOT</u> to wear earrings because of potential for accidents. However, if absolutely necessary, small round 'ball like' silver/gold earring studs may be worn. These <u>MUST</u> be removed for PE/Games or covered with a plaster provided by home.
- Hair for girls and boys which is longer than shoulder length MUST be tied back
- Boots are <u>NOT</u> to be worn in school by children
- Trouser length should not extend beyond the heel
- Extreme hair styles are not permitted. Hair should not be closely shaved and only natural hair colours are permitted
