Developing The Arts

As part of our drive to broaden our curriculum, at Dordon, we are looking for opportunities to explore and develop our arts provision in school. The Arts is classed as dance, creative writing, art, music and drama. There are many exciting initiatives in school that promote the Arts to all of our children. We are looking to open doors and show children the opportunities that exist in the creative world.

Music - Owl class have a visiting music teacher each week and have been learning to play different instruments - they are currently learning the ukulele. They are learning to read music and perform together. As a school, we have purchased a new music scheme - Charanga! to support teachers in the delivery of exciting music lessons pitched at age-related expectations. All pupils can choose to have individual music lessons provided by Independent Music Solutions - information is available from the office. Many children also choose to take part in Young Voices - the largest school choir in the world!

Dance - We have curriculum lessons delivered every other half term by Embody. I am sure as parents you have seen the quality work that is produced. Year 6 have been learning a Bollywood dance with the Hippodrome and will have the opportunity to perform on the main stage of the theatre as a culmination of their hard work.

Art - As a school we have welcomed in visiting artists. This week we have had Creaturama in school working with Y1 and Y5 on amazing 3D pieces. We are also working with Dordon Hall Designs on a local art project. Year 2 and Year 5 worked on making Chinese Lanterns as part of the New Year celebrations.

Drama - Reception have been working with the Hippodrome on dramatic performances based on 'Dear Zoo' and Swift class will this week be visiting the Hippodrome to undertake work relating to 'The Worst Witch'.

It is through exposing children to these opportunities that we hope to light a spark of imagination and creativity within the children and give our talented children a chance to shine. Who knows we may have the next stars of stage, screen or gallery within our walls at Dordon. Watch this space!
