Lateness

I am once again writing about the issue of lateness at Dordon. As I have shared previously, we monitor lateness on a weekly basis. In my article in January I highlighted the problem but I now find myself writing again as there has been little improvement.

Since January, there have been 232 lates at Dordon. This is an average of 5 children late per day . This means 5 children are having a disrupted start to their learning. If it were the same 5 children, then the response needed would be more targeted and personal. However, there are 29 children with 3 or more lates **this term**. This indicates a more widespread problem. Our school day starts promptly at 8:40am and it is our expectation that children are in school at this time.

Over the coming weeks, we will continue to monitor lateness and where there is no improvement, we will be inviting parents to come into school to discuss the issue with Miss McGroarty and myself.

Being on time means children have a settled start to their day. They receive the same messages from the teacher about learning as their peers and it enables them to feel secure. Children who are late often feel unsettled and lost as they have missed some key aspects of the day. At Dordon, we utilise every minute of the day and some key interventions and support are provided in the first 10 minutes of the day. Being late affects a child's chance to access this.

As with all things at Dordon, if there are issues with morning routines or with getting to school on time, we will try and help as much as we can. Ask to meet with Miss McGroarty or Miss Lewis and they will try and signpost the appropriate support services. We have many cases in school where that has been effective.

I look forward to reporting a more positive picture in the near future.
