Staff Development

In our schools, we are constantly looking to evolve, change and improve to maintain high standards and keep abreast of the ever-changing world of education. In order to do this there is a detailed programme of professional development that is tailor made to meet the needs of all staff and governors. This training can take many forms:

External training courses - this is where staff attend a training course off site to develop their skills, knowledge and expertise. This half term has seen staff attend courses on reading, writing, maths, science, developing skills as outstanding teachers and teaching assistants, planning educational visits and more.

Internal training - this is ongoing throughout the year and takes place during weekly staff meetings or on INSET days. It can be provided by staff in school or by consultants. Some training has included curriculum review, maths, art, health and safety, mental health and safeguarding.

Online training - Using training provided by colleges or organisations to develop skills. This is often undertaken in staff's own time. Examples of online training include safer recruitment, mental health qualifications and health and safety.

By providing these opportunities we are ensuring that our staff our well-equipped to complete their jobs to a very high standard. Our staff are incredibly dedicated and committed to being the best versions of themselves. As a school community we see ourselves as a group of learners - adults included. We never stop learning to achieve the best outcomes for our schools and the pupils.

Spot Light on Excellence...


Treasure Island

Warwickshire Road Safety Reminder

Throughout the year Warwickshire Road Safety Club visit the school and provide workshops for the children about road safety and have asked if you can remind children that when they cross the road they need to:

THINK about roads STOP and WAIT before the kerb LOOK and LISTEN carefully for traffic THINK about what to do CROSS safely, looking and listening

KS1 children should hold the hand of a trusted adult, stay away from the kerb and look for a safe place to cross with an adult. Children in KS2 should identify hazards limit distractions and take responsibility for making sensible and safe choices.
