Behaviour Policy

As you will know from previous articles our behaviour policy has been under review. We started with the positive rewards, changing from stars to GEMS and this has proven to be successful.

We have now completed our work on the logical consequences that will be applied for unacceptable behaviour. We have classified the behaviour and the logical consequence that will be in place for each stage.

Level One: behaviour that can be effectively managed within a classroom environment by the class teacher and Teaching assistant – a verbal or non-verbal prompt to allow pupils to rectify their behaviour

Level Two: more serious negative behaviour that is not so easily managed within a classroom environment or persistent level one type behaviour – may result in time missed from break

Level Three: Serious negative unacceptable behaviour or persistent level two type behaviour – sent to Senior Leaders. Parents may be called.

Level Four: Very serious unacceptable behaviour or persistent level three type behaviour – Parents will be involved. May involve a fixed term exclusion.

A full breakdown of the stages is in the policy which is available on the website.

As with everything at our school, we consider the pupils as individuals. Where behaviour is persistent or of significant worry, school will work with appropriate agencies to try and address the issues underlying the behaviour.

The partnership between school and parents when addressing unacceptable behaviour is key. We appreciate the support of parents when our logical consequences are applied as a result of the choices a child is making. Fortunately behaviour at our school is excellent and incidents of extreme behaviours are rare.
